




Autumn, a season of more urgent need for heart-warming sharing

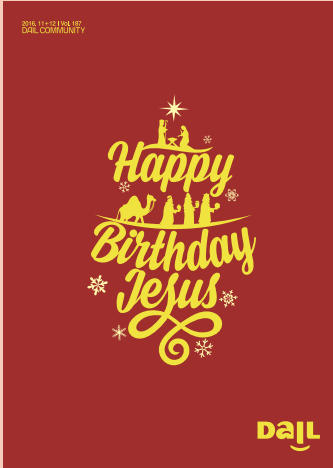
This month of October, with a rather chilly wind in the morning and evening, has already dawned on us. I would like to pass on heart-warming news to you.

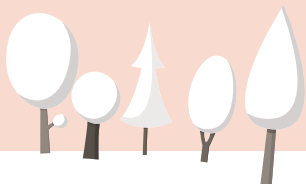

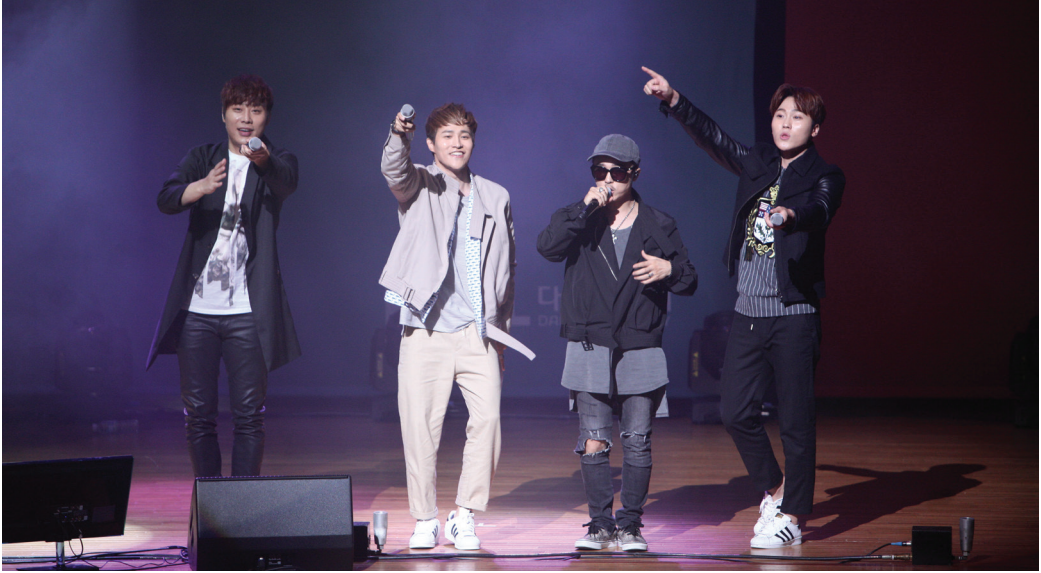

A Sharing Concert commemorating the Day of Angels on October 4 was successfully held due to the extensive care, interest and love of many people. The 'Reply 1992' Sharing Concert was also held in commemoration of the 24th anniversary of the 'Dail Angel Campaign' that began in 1992 for the purpose of the establishment of the first free hospital by a protestant church and the 14th anniversary of the completion of the construction of 'Dail Angel Hospital' as the result of the campaign. The concert lineup was set through a talent donation by Yeon-ji Kim, Geomi (spider), Ulala Session and Jeong Yeop on the 24th Day of Angels in Gyedang Hall, the Art Center of Sangmyung University, with a capacity to accommodate an audience of 1,500. This concert was particularly significant as all the proceeds of the event were donated to the funding of the construction of a Vision Center for the education of children of squatter settlements in Tanzania, Africa.

Yeon-ji Kim, the lead vocalist of See Ya and the 35th Mask King, singer Geomi who rose to the top of the real-time music chart with the OST for the highly popular TV drama, 'Love in the Moonlight', Jeong Yeop of Brown Eyed Soul with a highly sensual voice and Ulala Session, a very reliable performance group. The stage for the artists gathered in support of the realization of the precious dreams of children was consistently filled with the passionate support of the audience.



**Live interview on site | With Ulala Session, delightful conqueror of earth**

**Q** You have been giving consistently amazing concerts, befitting the description ‘Performance Group’ used to refer to your group. I am sure you will become even busier as the end of the year nears.

There have been extensive requests for our presence at a wide range of event as the end of the year is rapidly approaching. Although our schedule is full to the brim, we nonetheless are extremely happy with the enormous love our fans have given us.

**Q** You are participating in this concert as a part of the continuing talent contributions you have been making. Ulala Session’s diverse range of virtuous deeds through talent donation is widely known among the general public. What prompted you to start making such talent contributions?

I am sure that everyone is aware that our team leader, Yoon Taek, had been hospitalized for a substantial period of time. We frequently visited him at the hospital to cheer him up. During our visits, we met many people suffering from various illnesses and disabilities, and came to be aware of the aspects of their lives that we previously had no opportunity to encounter. Since then, I think we began to nurture the desire to offer some assistance to those in need with whatever modest talents we have.

**Q** You have been practicing a life of sharing for a prolonged period of time. What are the thoughts of Ulala Session on sharing?

We feel that sharing is practicing love. In fact, although there are so many people filled with love in their heart, the majority of them harbor such love only in their heart without showing it to others for various reasons. We believe sharing is the practicing of the love they nurture in their heart, for others. Frankly, we do not think sharing should be thought of as something grandiose. It is important to share even the most minor things through the practicing of love for others. We sincerely hope that many more people would have the opportunity to experience the joy and happiness of sharing by starting with simple things.

**Live interview on site |****With the 35th Mask King, Yeon-ji Kim**

**Q** After having become the 35th Mask King in August this year, you have been enjoying enormous popularity with the general public. What is the reason for your participation in this highly meaningful performance in spite of your busy schedule?

I am truly grateful for the enormous love I have received as a singer. However, when I was a member of a group, I did not have the freedom to make decisions to participate in such sharing activities. After my debut as a solo singer last year, I began to participate in a diverse range of sharing activities for our alienated neighbors with the desire to return the love I have been given thus far. Through these activities, I came to realize that my heart is filled with greater abundance as I shared to a greater extent with others. I decided to participate in this event without any hesitation since it is an event aimed at raising funds for the construction of a school for poverty-stricken children in Tanzania.

**Q** Would you like to say something to the audience who visited the Sharing Concert?

I have been informed that all the proceeds from the concert will be used for the construction of the school for poverty-stricken children in Tanzania. As such, you are participating in sharing already, only by purchasing a ticket, aren't you? All the artists today are determined to give wonderful performances on stage throughout the concert in appreciation of the kindness of the hearts of all the audience who came here today. I hope you will enjoy every bit of our show!

Q It is truly an honor to personally hear your characteristic millstone vocalization technique at such a close range. What have you been up to?

I haven't appeared on TV programs lately. Nonetheless, I am continuing to carry on with the radio broadcasting program called 'Music High of Jeong Yeop' along with occasional performances on stage.

Q Did you know that Angel Hospital was constructed solely with the donations made?

I learned that as I was preparing for this concert. I was pleasantly surprised that the funds for the construction of the hospital were collected through donations from so many people. The Angel Campaign, as a nation-wide funding campaign to raise the financial resources necessary, has finally blossomed after 10 years, hasn't it? I was greatly moved as a fellow Korean as I was watching the video on the history of the construction of the hospital through fundraising, out of the kindness of all the people of Korea, although the economic situation here would have been substantially more difficult 24 years ago than now.

Q You are participating in the concert as a part of your talent donation. I was also told that you always have had a lot of interest in the donation culture.

Yes. As I am always in the position of being a beneficiary of the enormous love of my audience and fans as a singer, I consistently think about how I can return the love I received by using the talents I have. Out of my desire to participate in a new format of donation, for 2 years I have participated in a donation performance that combines music with food called 'Food Concert', with the renowned chef, Sam Kim. I consistently realize that being able to offer assistance to others with the talents I have is a truly moving and fulfilling experience. I decided to join in this concert because it is a venue for sharing with the poverty-stricken children in Tanzania and I sincerely hope to experience the joy of sharing with all those present here today.

Live interview on site | With Jeong Yeop, renowned for his highly sensual voice Yeon-ji Kim

Q The OSTs for the dramas ‘Descendant of the Sun’ and ‘Love in the Moonlight’ appear to sweep the music charts, if sung by Geomi. You have an extremely busy schedule these days, don’t you?

I scheduled nation-wide concerts to see more people at closer range. I started in Ulsan on September 24 and am currently holding concerts in a total of 8 cities including Daegu, Changwon, Suwon, Daejeon, Gwangju, Jeonju and Seoul.

Q 4 teams of singers decided to collaborate to support the dreams of the children in Tanzania. I was told that you have also agreed to participate quite readily and willingly.

Yes. I once read a news article on child labor and learned that child labor is cruelly exploited throughout the world, including in carpet, cigarette and brick factories, etc. In particular, I learned that 1 out of 3 children in Tanzania is headed to worksites instead of school every morning. My heart ached with a tormenting pain as I saw the images of little children with thin and frail hands holding on to hammers instead of pencils. I am in full agreement that learning is the only hope for severing and eradicating the ties of poverty passed down generation to generation in underdeveloped countries. Accordingly, I gladly consented to participate in this concert after hearing that all the proceeds will be used for the construction of a Vision Center for the provision of children’s education in order for them to become self-sufficient in the future.

Q You are about to conclude the last chapter of the Stage of Dreams for the children in Tanzania. Would you like to say farewell greetings to the audiences who participated in this meaningful event over a substantial period of time?


I feel that the show today was even more valuable and meaningful because of the audience who came to join us for this wonderful cause. The next song is ‘Lost Stars’, which became highly popular as the OST for the movie ‘Begin Again’. I would be most grateful if you would think about all the children in Tanzania continuing to suffer from the burden of poverty even at this very moment.





### **For the lost dreams of the children...**

All of the proceeds from the event were used to fund the construction of a Vision Center for the children of squatter settlements in Tanzania, where Dail Community is ardently pursuing our mission work. Children in the quarry in Kunduchi are referred to as the "absolute" poverty stricken class, even in a country as poor as Tanzania.

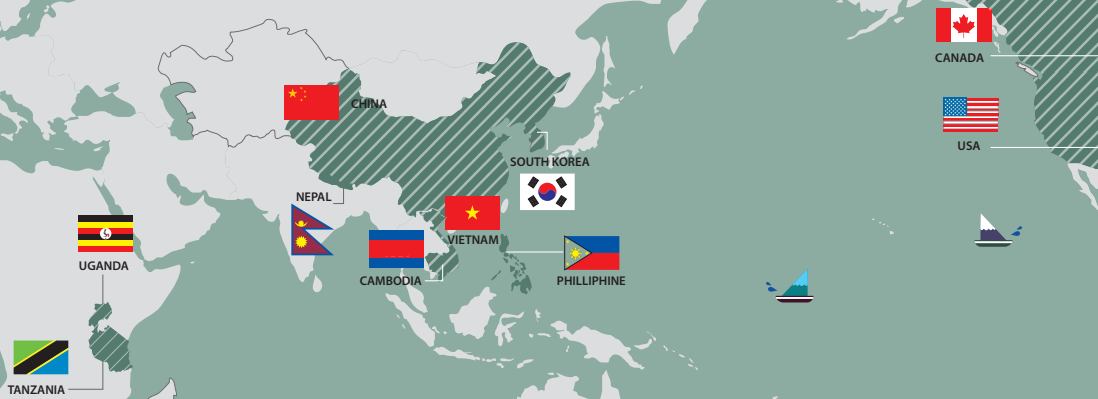
They are engaged in the work of shattering stones for 12 hours every day, with heavy hammers that are difficult to hold onto even with both hands. Children of the squatter settlements in Kunduchi are headed to the quarry rather than school every day after having had their right to education taken away from them. Park, Sang-won, honorary ambassador for public relations of Dail Community, who was presented with the Plaque of Merit during the event, requested more concern and love from a greater number of people in order for the children in Kunduchi to regain their lost dreams. We look forward to the day in which the 'Construction of the Vision Center', as the foundation for the hope to realize the dreams of the children, is completed through the continuing of the precious 'Miracle of Sharing' that enabled construction of 'Angel Hospital' through the 'Angel Campaign.'

## Story from the field

### NEPAL

#### From Babfor (free meal) and Bbangfor (free bread) to Ggumfor (free education)!

Dail Community, beginning with emergency relief immediately following the occurrence of the earthquake in Nepal, has been continuously carrying out restoration activities including dispatchment of a relief team more than 10 times. We have not only distributed emergency relief supplies consisting of rice, tents and mosquito nets by using Babfor vehicles, but also have been taking care of those suffering from the earthquake by opening medical

camps to ensure that they will not lose their hope in the midst of immense pain.

Once, Pastor Choi, Il Do, the founder of Dail Community, visited Nepal for emergency relief. The great earthquake of Nepal not only took away structures but also the lives of the people of Nepal. The pastor proposed establishment of an orphanage for the children who lost their parents due to the earthquake, in addition to the sharing of meals and bread in the regions of the ministry of Dail Community. In responding to this proposal, 3 local residents who have been closely observing the ceaseless serving of the affected people by the Dail Community in the regions of earthquake conveyed their



intent to support the pastor's plan by allowing Dail Community to use their land for free as the site of the orphanage in gratitude for the kindness of Dail Community. 'Lilla Bhakta Shrestha' offered to Dail Community the use of as much land as she owns as needed for free, to establish the orphanage in her country that has an enormous number of poverty stricken people who have been subjected to a great deal of pain. She even proceeded to draft an agreement with her lawyer as soon as she decided to make this offer.

Following the kind offer by 'Lilla Bhakta Shrestha', 'Sindupalchowk' region and the 'Bumtar' region of Kolati city with the view of the In-drawati River were chosen as the sites for the construction of the orphanage. We sincerely hope that we will be able to construct Ggumfor of Nepal and an orphanage in these regions to become the venue of our ministry and enable the children of Nepal to overcome their painful realities to seek, enjoy and communicate a beautiful world.

We need approximately 300 million Won in order to construct an orphanage on the chosen land. Just as we were able to secure the land through the Grace of God, we ask for your prayer that the funds for the construction will also be raised as soon as possible. Moreover, we seek your support and encouragement in order for the Babfor and Bbangfor to be extended to Ggumfor in Nepal in order that children under desperate circumstances can be nurtured into the children of light and workers of God who can witness the influence of Jesus to the rest of the world. We pray that we will be able to hold them up with the hands of love.

### **Field trip picnic of Dail Kindergarten on September 7**

Children at Philippine Dail Kindergarten take a field trip picnic in September every year. The picnic on September 7 this year was at the Paradise Zoo, which is located about an hour's drive from the kindergarten.

Although it would be great to have this kind of picnic that the children are looking forward to so much more often, we are able to have only 1 picnic a year given our current situation. The kindergarten picnic for children 4 years old needs to be accompanied by parents for various reasons, such as the safety and education of the children. However, spending a whole day with the children is a very difficult decision for their parents who are unable to take a day off from their work due to their extremely poor economic conditions and having to work every day for their livelihood.

On September 7, everyone gathered in time as the picnic had been announced quite a while



ago. Children unable to pay the participation fee due to their financial difficulties were given support through a 1:1 sisterhood relationship. Although there were some children who could not be matched through the sisterhood relationship, the staff made donations to cover the cost of these children's participation. Jasmin, who lives with her grandmother because her mother has to work in a factory, was so delighted to spend a whole day with her mother who took a day off for her she had a smile on her face throughout the day with happiness. Her grandmother, who is taking care of her, shed tears of overwhelming happiness at the sight of the joyous excitement of her granddaughter, from the early hours of the morning until the bus taking her to the picnic took off.

Perhaps due to great expectations, the images of the zoo we saw after arrival were somewhat disappointing. The zoo had a gathering of animals that can be seen frequently and commonly, in a small area with much poorer facilities than those we had visited in Korea. However, after seeing the children thoroughly enjoying themselves while feeding the animals so excitedly and innocently, we realized that the scale and facilities of the zoo were not important to these children. During the lunch hour, all the children had lunch that each household had prepared along with chicken and cookie sets that Dail Community prepared for the children in the shade of the trees. The apparent happiness they displayed made everyone feel like we were in heaven. After having had a hearty

meal, we all gathered on a wide grass field and played exciting games including a treasure hunt, eating candies hanging from string, running in a potato sack, etc. In fact, all the local staff were more engaged in the games than the parents, and the parents more than the children, eventually leading all the adults to feel embarrassed for enjoying the event even more so than the children.

Looking back, although the local staff, including the teachers of the Dail Kindergarten, are slightly better off than the children financially, they rarely have an opportunity to participate and enjoy events such as this, and cannot spend money and time, other than at the picnic at the Dail Kindergarten. Realizing this, we suddenly felt sorry for the staff excitedly enjoying themselves like children.

It was an exciting and joyous picnic in which all the children and adults mingled with each other in wonderful harmony! After spending all their energy in having so much fun, all the children fell asleep in the bus returning home even before the sweat on their forehead had time to dry. As we were looking at the angelic faces of children sound asleep, we sincerely prayed for the coming of a day in which they would be able to thoroughly enjoy their daily lives by escaping from the miserable poverty they are suffering now as soon as possible.

**Through the campaign for 1 Peso for 1 person, which is like a campaign for the maintenance of self-respect at the cost of 100 Won...**

While handing out meals to children several days ago, a woman visited Babfor with a flushed face. I greeted her with the concern that we might have done something wrong,

but she suddenly handed me an envelope. When I carefully looked into the envelope, I found a letter written in Tagalog and an English translation of the letter along with 316 Pesos (equivalent to about 8,000 Won). I was greatly moved by the contents of the letter I read.

The residents of the community in the vicinity of Babfor in which the poorest among those in the regions of Marlea lived were thankful for the serving of Dail Community, regardless of religion and without asking anything in return, and held a campaign for donating of 1 Peso per person. I held onto her hands although she wanted to go back hurriedly, perhaps out of her embarrassment for the small donation amount in the envelope, and asked her to say a word to the children having their meals at the time. Although I was not able to fully understand Tagalog, I was able to understand and sympathize with her thoughts as she talked to the children and us with tears in her eyes. When I proposed, "Let's continue with this campaign you started! However, let's make the next campaign to be a campaign for the children in cooperation with Dail Community, rather than for the purpose of the thanking of Dail Community by the village residents!" Upon hearing my words, she shed even more tears and promised to participate in such a desired campaign before she left.

Just as the small show of sincerity by the working women in 588 of Korea became the seed that blossomed into the countless number of hands of Angels, thereby miraculously leading to the completion of construction and the eventual operation of the Dail Angel Hospital, I have no doubt whatsoever that 316 Pesos that the local residents raised in the distant alienated provincial village in the Philippines

that no one pays attention to will become the seed and accomplish the miracle of 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish of Jesus.

Philippine Dail Community began with the donation of the cost of maintenance of self-esteem of 100 Won for Babfor in Cheongnyang-ri, Korea, and the campaign to donate 1 Peso per person that the residents of the community held voluntarily. It is too miraculous to think that the similarities between these 2 events is just a coincidence. We ask for your prayers in order for this miracle that began with the love of God to ceaselessly continue on.

1. Please become a sponsor for the 1:1 sisterhood relationship with children!


There still are a lot of children who are unable to attend school because they cannot pay the tuition fee, and the single meal they have at Babfor is the only meal they have for the day. Please become a sponsor for the children in order for them to go to school without worrying about money and to have at least 2 meals a day, one at Babfor and one at home.

2. We sincerely need assisting hands for the Angel Clinic.

As a large extended family is living in a small room with the rice bags covering the walls under a leaking roof, on a road on which rubbish is littered and sewage water flows, there is a

high rate of prevalence of water transmitted contagious diseases such as skin and eye and dengue spread by mosquitoes. Please become a sponsor in order for us to normalize the operation of the clinic, including the securing of medical volunteers, medical supplies, etc.

3. Please become a mentor in order for the youth to continue on with their dreams.

4-year old children who were the first to graduate from the Dail Kindergarten have already become teenagers. Although we are continuing to safely protect the future hopes they have written with their small hands, the realities they are confronted with are too severe for them to realize their dreams. We are praying for the miracle of the commencement of Dail Hope School in the Philippines in order for them to sustain and realize their dreams. Accordingly, we are waiting for your valuable sponsorship that will be the starting point of this new beginning..

It is such a fulfilling and proud experience to see the children mature rapidly through such learning.

These children will be sitting for tests and interviews to transfer into general elementary school from the middle of December. Our children were able to successfully complete their studies and grow up in good health for their next step into a wider world because of the concerns and love of all of our sponsors. ### Story of Special Me

On every Tuesday and Thursday of the week, ceaseless questions of children continue from the early hours of the morning. "Teacher, we are studying English today, aren't we?", "Teacher, do I come at 2 PM today?" Children gather in large number and continually throw questions at me. They are repeatedly asking whether we will have the class they have been waiting for excitedly for confirmation.

When the teachers bring the study material to the classroom, children will take them from the teacher's hands with a willing attitude of assisting the teacher. Then, they will head to the 2nd floor of the library, which is the venue for the nurturing of their dreams. When the tightly locked door to this venue is opened, children rush in and take their respective seats without being told to do so. When the teachers call their names out to check attendance, they answer 'here!' with the loudest voice that they can muster and everyone answers 'I am happy!' when asked how they are.

Children love the English class held on Tuesdays and Thursdays of every week the most. Once the English class starts, students learn English songs with accompanying bodily movements. For the songs they like very much, they request, "Teacher, one more time please!" and will sing them with loud voices. The eyes of the

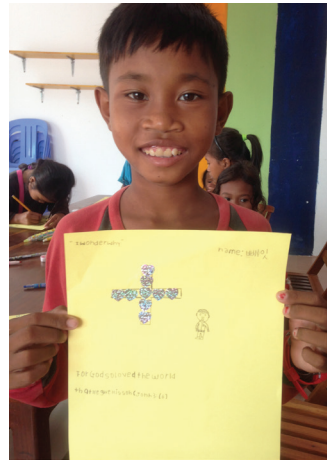
children glitter with concentration when we begin the lessons by taking out the Big Book (large and thick picture book) after the singing session. The Special Me Big Book appears very appealing to the eyes of the children. Beautiful pictures of the Book are transferred to and fill up the glittering eyes of the children. They attentively and carefully listen to the English pronunciation by the teacher and read the contents together with a loud voice. Although there are children who are still not familiar with the alphabet, they enjoy the English children's story hour through which they can easily learn English. During the workbook hour that follows, they cut out and paste pictures by using scissors or draw pretty pictures with varicolored crayons. Since there are no separate arts and physical education classes at the school in Cambodia, the English class in which they can engage in a diverse range of arts and physical education activities including singing and drawing pictures is the favorite class of these children. Children say farewell to the teachers in English with smiling and cheerful expressions on their faces when the school hours end. Some children always convey the words, "Good Bye, teacher! See you, I Love you" containing warmth in their heart, as they are leaving the school.

Thankfully, 'Special Me' promised to regularly provide workbooks every month from October to our lovely children in Cambodia. We are so grateful for your kindness, which made our English classes in Cambodia markedly more abundant and enjoyable.

Currently, Cambodia Dail Community is pre-



paring a small project that will enable the children to nurture bigger dreams through the English classes. It is the English children's story class! We seek your support and love in order for this class to be operated harmoniously and smoothly. In particular, as we are in need of a large number of children's books, we would be most grateful for all those wishing to support us in nurturing the dreams of these children.
