
New Beginnings in 2017

The 29th Street Christmas Service held \with our alienated neighbors

Our Street Christmas Service was held in the front yard of the Babfor Sharing Movement headquarters at 11AM on Saturday, December 24, 2016, and was attended by approximately 3,000 people including alienated neighbors such as homeless persons, wanderers and elderly with no one to rely on, and numerous guests including Honorable Ambassador Mark Lippert of the US Embassy in Korea and Pastor Jong Sam Park, the former chairman of World Vision, as well as volunteers and the staff of Dail Community. This is an event held for our alienated neighbors who have to spend the bitter cold months of winter on their own. We were able to distribute packages composed of winter clothes, hot packs and lunch boxes for approximately 2,500 elderly people to assist them in getting through the winter months.

Sincerity gathered through concerted efforts

We were very concerned because we were not able to receive sponsorship for winter clothes from the companies that have always sponsored our event in previous years, perhaps due to the difficult circumstances in Korea during 2016. However, we were able to miraculously prepare the winter clothes, hot packs and lunch boxes to be presented to the elderly through the concerted efforts of all the staff of Dail Community and numerous sponsors who show ceaseless love for Dail Community.

In particular, 'Baedaleui Minjok (the nation of delivery)', the foremost leading delivery App in Korea, provided us with 6,000 hot packs, thereby enabling us to distribute 2 hot packs to more than 2,500 seniors. We were able to successfully hold the 29th Street Christmas Service because of the whole-hearted support from an extensive range of supporters, including not only the Baedaleui Minjok, but also domestic and overseas sponsors who gathered their sincerity in preparation for the Street Christmas Service. Volunteer students also made contributions for the cost of winter preparation packages from their allowances when they visited Babfor to volunteer after having heard of the adverse situations that seniors are confronted with. We would like to convey our sincerest gratitude to all the hidden angels of Dail once again.

Our hope that seniors with no one to rely on will spend winter in warmth

Seniors who received the package to get through the winter months with elated expressions on their faces grabbed the hands and thanked each and every staff of Dail Community. As they were well aware of the dire economic and social situation in Korea, it seems that they felt even greater warmth of the valuable attitude of sharing coming from the countless number of people behind the scenes. The 29th Street Christmas Service was held in a particularly chilly environment! Although it was an arduous experience to prepare the packages to be distributed and to guide the attendants for the event in the early hours of the morning in spite of the bitter cold wind, we were greatly moved emotionally and were able to experience the grace of God as we met seniors who conveyed their gratitude with facial expressions overflowing with happiness.

We sincerely hope that seniors will be able to spend the bitter cold months of winter in greater warmth with the package of sincerity presented.

Meeting between Lay Kim Loeurn and sponsors

Do you remember Lay Kim Loeurn, “a life” more precious than the world?

A pale face with frail arms and legs

Lay Kim Loeurn, who was 11 years old and was suffering from heart disease when we first met, has already become a 16-year old boy and a regular healthy prankster

Lay Kim Loeurn is a Cambodian boy who underwent heart surgery through the Dail Community in 2012.

In November of last year, Lay Kim Loeurn visited Korea to meet the sponsors who have been providing support for him for a long period of time.

Lay Kim Loeurn managed to regain brighter and healthier laughter through the enormous love he received from many people during the last 5 years after the surgery!

Lay Kim Loeurn had an emotionally moving encounter with the sponsors who breathed life into a child who was barely surviving, as described below.

Relay of sharing of love

"Dear Pastor, I hope that this money, although it is a small amount, will be used for a child suffering from heart diseases like my daughter." This mother, with a daughter who is diagnosed with heart disease and is expected to live only for another 2~3 years, prayed that she would be able to see her daughter enroll in elementary school. However, her daughter was fully cured through surgery arranged by Dail Community, and enrolled not only in elementary school but also graduated from middle school and enrolled in high school, and has continued to lead a miraculous life for more than 15 years.

Mrs. Sun Ja Lim (alias), one of the sponsors of Lay Kim Loeurn, delivered the entire term-deposit she had been saving over a period of 10 years to Lay Kim Loeurn through Dail Community with a wish to present new life to those suffering from heart diseases like her daughter. Through the concerted efforts of such sponsors, Lay Kim Loeurn was able to undergo heart surgery in 2012 and was offered a new life after the surgery, just as Mrs. Sun Ja Lim wanted.

Mrs. Sun Ja Lim and Lay Kim Loeurn met in December last year in the hospital ward where Mrs. Sun Ja Lim is hospitalized for her renal diseases. Mrs. Sun Ja Lim has lived a life of sharing with less fortunate neighbors although she has been undergoing dialysis over the last 20 years.

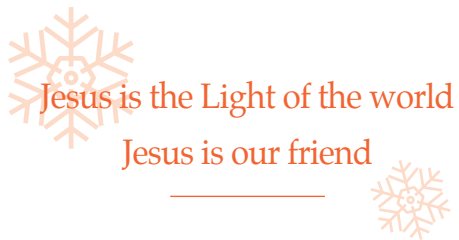
"I now have 3 fathers!"

At the end of November last year, Lay Kim Loeurn visited the Gwangju Penitentiary to meet the 1:1 child sponsor he had been want-

ing to meet for a long time.

The encounter between the sponsor, Mr. Jeong Won Shin (alias) and Lay Kim Loeurn continued only through body language and by staring into each other's eyes to share their hearts, without the need for the assistance of an interpreter even once. The warm encounter between them in the middle of the bitter cold winter imparted profound emotional fulfillment that will last throughout the lives of the members of Dail who participated in the special meeting. Lay Kim Loeurn was embraced by Mr. Jeong Won Shin who was ceaselessly shedding tears of happiness as they put their faces together, and said through tears that, "I will now call you father". At the sight of this special encounter, all the members of Dail were greatly moved and also began to shed tears that they had been holding.

We vividly remember what Lay Kim Loeurn said as we were leaving the penitentiary: "I now have 3 fathers!" These are his birth father who is a fisherman in a squatter settlement on waters in Cambodia, his father of faith who gave life through his heart and provided monthly living expenses even though confined in a penitentiary in Korea, and God the Father in Heaven. He stated that he has these 3 fathers and this confession moved everyone present. We sincerely pray that Lay Kim Loeurn, who is receiving overflowing love from these 3 fathers, will become a person who will be able to return the love he received 2 and 3 fold to others. We ask for your prayers in order for Lay Kim Loeurn to continue to grow as a child of love in the future. **dail**

Christmas Festival in Nepal

On December 17, the most anticipated event of the year of Nepal Dail Community will be held. It is the Christmas Festival held with the Gentoo. Nepal worships 330 million gods. The people of Nepal hold ceremonies for forehead coloring and hanging flower necklaces even on dogs being served as gods. How much more noble should the Christmas Festival for the celebration of the birth of Jesus born to deliver salvation of mankind be?

85% of the people of Nepal are believers of Hinduism, and it is prohibited to evangelize or hold Bible study for the purpose of conversion

of children under the age of 18 to Christianity. Accordingly, spreading the Good News is quite difficult in Nepal. Moreover, Christmas has been excluded as a national holiday from this year. As such, it was particularly more difficult to hold a noble Christmas event to be enjoyed with the people of Nepal.

However, we managed to complete preparations for the Christmas event with the good guidance of God. 15 churches in the surrounding areas of the squatter settlements were united and approximately 2,500 participants enjoyed the Christmas event this year. We presented a towel with the printed phrase "Jesus is the Light of the World and Jesus is our friend" along with a tasty snack to all those who were invited to the festival. Moreover, we sang songs including one with the lyric "Jesus is the Light of the World and Jesus is our friend" and danced together.

Christmas Festival in Nepal in 2016 was held in the spiritual battlefield. Although we expe-

The first running shoes in life

I got a call from a sponsor who has forged a 1:1 child sponsorship.

"I would like to give a Christmas present to Louise (the 1:1 sponsorship child) and I want to ask what would be appropriate?"

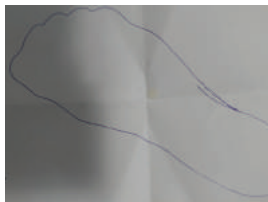
The next day, I met and asked Louise. He said, "I want to have a pair of running shoes, blue colored running shoes."

"I see. What is your foot size?"

". Can you wait a minute?"

He then suddenly ran out, making me puzzled.

In about 5 minutes, Louise appeared again

with a sheet of paper with a roughly drawn outline of his foot, as though he had to draw it

in a hurry. Louise, who is 14 years old

this year, never had shoes that fit him properly and did not know his correct shoe size. Think-

ing back, this is the case not only for Louise but for all other children.

Filipinos love basketball regardless of their age. Accordingly, they put up a basketball court wherever there is vacant space. Even if the floor is uneven and slanted, they will put up the hoop if there is sufficient space to bounce the ball. However, there is not even a single child who plays basketball with proper shoes in the area surrounding our Center.

When I passed on the drawing of the foot and story of Louise to the sponsor, the sponsor enjoyed the drawing and story as though seeing

a younger brother and promised to send a good pair of running shoes shortly. It made me feel so happy just imagining how happy Louise would be when he received and wore the shoes that are just

perfect for his feet for the first time in his life.

Wouldn't presenting shoes that are the perfect size for the children and preparing presents only for one person be the easiest way of letting the children experience that "they are special"?

Things that can be done VS things that need to be done

4 young men suddenly visited the Philippines

Babfor. All 4 young men walked in limping with numerous bandages applied all over their bodies. All of them were riding a motorcycle together and tumbled onto the road in a lump when the motorcycle fell over. One had bandages wrapped around an entire arm, another the entire thigh, while another had a towel over his head. When the towel was lifted, he had a cut in his head, which appeared to be stitched up roughly in a hurry. They visited the hospital once after the motorcycle accident for treatment. However, they decided to come to our Center because they had no money to go to the hospital again.

The thought that entered my mind instantaneously was clear and simple.

"This is not something I can handle myself..." They had injuries that were too severe for me to handle since all I had done in the past was to put on ointment on the small injuries of children and handed out drugs for the common cold. Therefore, as I was entering the room used to store medicine, thinking that I would give a couple of ointments to each of the young men, with the feeling of being sorry for not being able to do more, it also occurred to me that they probably would not come back to visit the Center again if I sent them away with a couple of ointments in their hands. At that moment, it became very clear what I had to do. Accordingly, I brought out a bunch of disinfectants, gauze and antibiotic ointments, and said to the young men who were quite hesitant:

"Come in! brothers. Let's try!"

I used one and a half huge bottles of disinfectant just to peel off the bandages that were en-

tangled with the blood clotted wound and was able to take care of all their wounds, although shabbily, after having struggled for more than an hour coaxing them as they complained about the substantial pain of my treatment.

Following this incident, I had 4 more young men who I can exchange welcoming greetings with in addition to the children of the Center. As I began to exchange greetings with these young men, it seemed that the facial expressions and attitudes of at least 40 more people in the neighborhood have become more positive. Although I was able to barely overcome the crisis of this incident with the grace of God, I felt that a more definitive means of dealing with emergency situations was necessary. I added another prayer to my list. Dear God, please send me an assistant who will be able to take charge of the Dail Angel's Clinic, or, at least, provide me an opportunity to undergo training to better treat emergency medical situations. **DAIL**

Thank you sponsors! We graduated!

Tanzania Hope Class managed to graduate 3 classes of students during the last 3 years. Among the 39 students of the 3rd Hope Class who began studying in February of the year prior to last, 36 students (with the exclusion of 3 very young students) graduated on December 14 last year. These 3 students who were not included in the 3rd graduating class will continue their studies with the 4th graduating class while the 36 students who graduated will be transferred into 3rd, 4th or 5th grades in ordinary elementary school to continue with their formal education.

Children who did not even know the alphabet and could not draw straight lines are able to proficiently read and write Swahili language, the official language of Tanzania, and make simple English expressions. In addition to these fruits we were able to harvest, Asifiwe and Elis who is suffering from the genetic disease of sickle cell anemia, studied hard and was able to be transferred to ordinary school Asifiwe and Elis lived in the midst of pain every day before encountering Dail Community. These children are provided with medicine every month as well as education through Dail Community, and are able to restore their physical and mental health to a sufficient extent that enables them to be transferred to ordinary school and give outstanding academic performances. We are greatly moved and thankful for the prog-

ress these children made in spite of their extreme difficulties.

One of the graduating students is Daudi who has been made fun of by friends due to polydactylia resulting from a negligent mother who is suffering from alcohol addiction. Daudi managed to graduate in 2 years by fully being immersed in studies in spite of the difficult family environment and having undergone surgery for polydactylia when Daudi was introduced to Dail Community. After having been transferred to numerous houses, Daudi finally met a kind neighbor who decided to take Daudi in as one of his family, thereby putting an end to the life of this drifter. We sincerely ask for your prayers that Daudi will be able to continue with formal studies at an ordinary school.

Dear sponsors, our children were able to have nutritional meals and study hard at the Hope Class over the period of a year because of the grace of God and the ardent support from our sponsors. We are always so grateful to our sponsors. Asante sana! **dail**

Hankuk Oral School for the Deaf is a school established on the foundation of the love of Christ and a spirit of devotion for the country and people. Under the motto of honesty, love and consistency, the school provides 'oral education' in order for the students with oral disabilities to speak and students with hearing disabilities to hear. This is done by best using residual hearing capabilities in order for them to harmoniously communicate with others by expressing their thoughts and feelings in words.

When I was told that these students wanted to provide voluntary services for the seniors, I was frankly worried at first. However, it did not take long to eliminate my concerns as they ardently served the seniors by communicating through body language and by gazing into each other's eyes, enabling me to realize that my concerns at first were totally groundless.

These students, who were serving the seniors more enthusiastically than any other ordinary middle and high school students, assisted with the eating of meals by aligning their eyes with those of the seniors and even tidied up the place afterwards. After this heartwarming display of an attitude of serving others, they received ceaseless praise throughout their stay at the Center.

Following the completion of the voluntary service, they gathered to take a group photograph. Not being able to hear the countdown of 'one, two and three', students assumed their own widely varying poses according to their respective timing, along with a most cheerful facial expression that drew out bright smiles from the faces of all the staff.

Although they did not display overflowing vitality like other students their age who had worked noisily in the past, and they had some difficulties in carrying out voluntary service activities because they could not hear the details explained by the staff clearly, we were able to spend an extremely thankful and happy day because of the students of the Oral School for the Deaf who had louder voices of love for the less fortunate neighbors. We will always cheer for the students and teachers of Oral School for the Deaf and we pray that you will lead valuable lives of conveying the message of love not only through words but also through your lives themselves.

The President of DAIL Little Heaven

Si Jae Ryu (60 years old), who recovered from cerebral infarction and hemi-paralysis like a tumbling doll, is a person who lived on the streets by spending all his days drinking and smoking. He forged a relationship with Dail Little Heaven by meeting Mi Gyeong Kim, the head chef at Dail Little Heaven, while having a meal at Babfor and is currently a resident in Dail Little Heaven.

At the time, Mr. Si Jae Ryu was suffering cerebral infarction and hemi-paralysis, and was not able to use his right arm and could barely speak. Nonetheless, with strong volition for rehabilitation, he began to work as a laundry assistant at the Dail Angel's Hospital and underwent 1 week of linguistic therapy at the brain rehabilitation hospital with a monthly income of 380,000 Won. Although he diligently pursued his life, he absolutely needed not only linguistic therapy but also rehabilitation exercise due to increasingly hardening body! At the time of dire need of a helping hand, there was a miracle of the application made by a staff member of Dail Little Heaven being selected in

the publicly open "Happiness Stock Exchange" project, a Community Chest of Korea. Accordingly, Mr. Si Jae Ryu got the opportunity to undergo more extensive treatment. With the 5 million Won provided by the publicly open project, he was hospitalized for treatment at a brain rehabilitation hospital that he had visited several times before. He underwent linguistic therapy (231 composite treatment) and behavioral therapy (152 development treatment for central nerve system and 266 composite treatment) during 1 year of hospitalization, and was able to incrementally restore his health.

He then returned to Dail Little Heaven with substantially improved overall health. When Si Jae Ryu returned to Dail Little Heaven, all the staff congratulated him for his restored health by singing the song, 'You are a person born to be loved!' We sincerely hope that Mr. Si Jae Ryu will continue to accumulate wonderful memories together at Dail Little Heaven and re-enter his social life with even more improved health by further succeeding in his rehabilitation.

Outstanding staff of SK

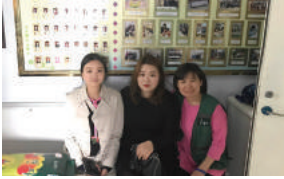

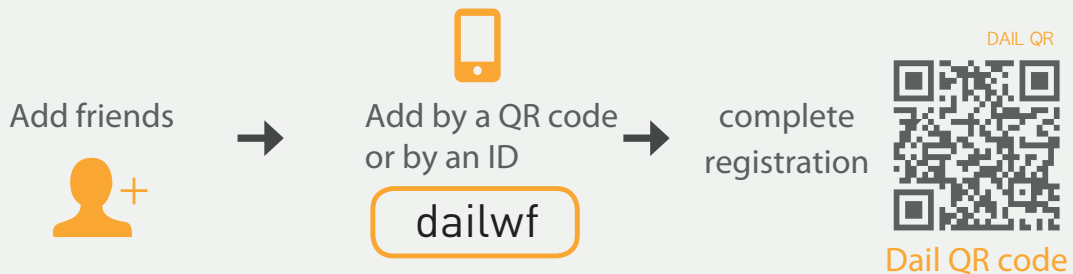
