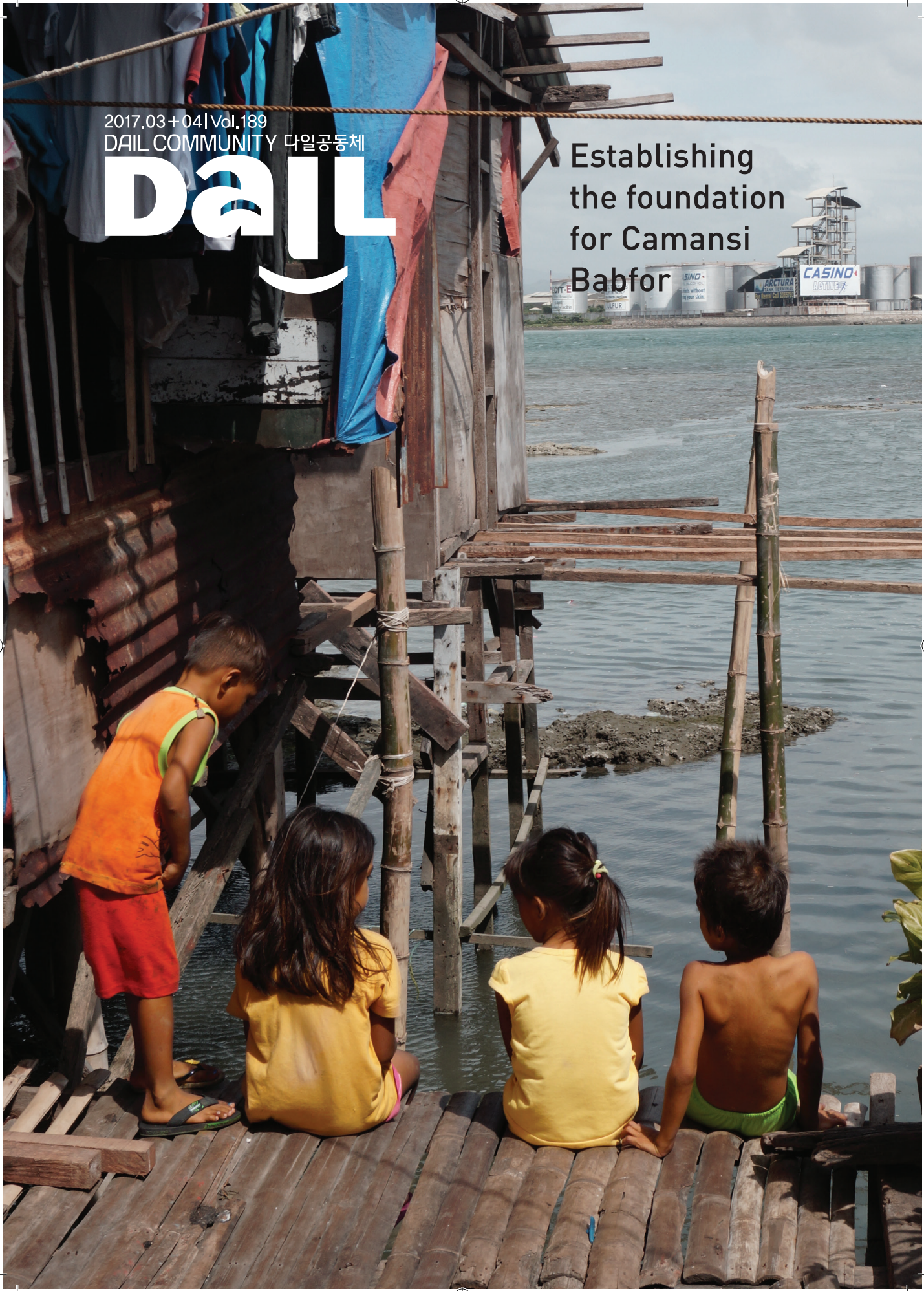

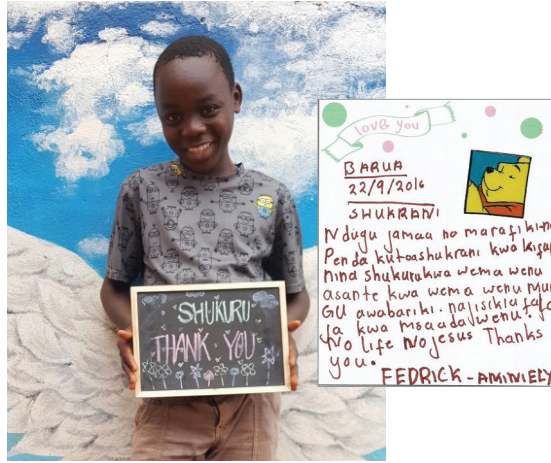


Wishing that everyone has a **hopeful spring**

In particular I sincerely pray that the spring of 2017 will be a season overflowing with hope and the budding of new life. I have been able to successfully complete a Philippines Vision Trip. During the Vision Trip, our team visited Camansi Village, a squatter settlement on the waters in the Lapu Lapu District of Mactan Island in the central region of the Philippines. My heart ached at seeing the dilapidated and poor residential environment of the squatter settlement in which the residences were constructed by piling wooden posts into the sea and small huts made of any pieces of wood they could get their hands on. These huts were barely supported by connected bamboo poles. Moreover, the anxiety and apprehension I saw in the eyes of the children in the village who appeared more precarious than the huts continued to torment my heart even after my return from the Philippines. Remembering the gaze of these children that I could not forget (even after several days), I was certain that Camansi is another site of the realization of a mission that God has given to us.

At the end of last year, the residents of the villages in the vicinity of Philippines Dail Community located in Cavite started a voluntary fundraising campaign we refer to as the 'Miracle of 1 Peso' aimed at providing assistance for the ministry of Dail Community by the village residents who were deeply touched by the continuous serving and sharing by Dail Community with the local citizens. The news of this campaign spread to Korea last month and we also commenced the campaign for sharing of the 'Miracle of 1 Peso'. I have full faith that this campaign will result in the works and miracle of God of giving birth and saving lives through the establishment of a new Dail Community, through Babfor and Ggumfor, and even in Camansi in the near future. I ask for your help in order for the warmth of the sunlight to be shone into every dark crevice of Camansi, a squatter settlement in Sebu, Philippines, by participating in the 'Miracle of 1 Peso' until the dream of turning the miracle of Cavite into the miracle of Camansi is realized. I ask for your sincere prayers that the spring of 2017 will become a truly hopeful spring for us and them, and that you will actively participate in the priming of this miracle by uniting in our cause through your valuable donations! ^^

Precarious entanglement of bamboo bridges

'Camansi Village', a squatter settlement on water, is encountered as you walk several steps along an unpaved road next to the main one, which is lined with a large shopping mall on the left, and hotels and an array of convenience facilities on the right; it is as though you have entered a totally different world.

Although you took only a few more steps, Camansi Village pops up in front of your eyes with colorless scenery that appears to be extremely silent (to the extent of being melancholic), with the instantaneous disappearance of the splendor and bustling activities of the city. As I entered the village, my eyes fell on residences constructed by piling bamboo posts into the sea, rather than firm ground, and small huts made of any pieces of wood the residents could get their hands on, along with precariously shabby bamboo bridges linking the huts. My heart ached as I looked into the eyes of the residents, who appeared to be filled with apprehension and seemed more miserable than the huts on water on the verge of collapse. It was a truly a miserable appearance of a village, and made me doubt whether it was in reality a place of residence for people.

We blindly entered the Camansi Village without a guide, but we were able to hear details about the Camansi Village from a pastor we met, as though we had had a prearranged appointment. "It is 90%. 90% of the village residents are at or below absolute poverty level. Although they are in dire need of assistance, no such assistance is given to any of them." As I was listening to the pastor, I became most concerned about the children in the village. "More than 50% of the children are unable to attend school. The majority of residents are drug addicts. Drug addiction in the village is so severe that people joke that 150% of all adults in the village are drug addicts. In fact, the parents of these children are either living the life of a drug addict in the village, or are in jail because of drugs..."

With parents like these, it is very easy for children to give in to the temptations of various addictions. Very young children become 'addicted' to internet they use by inserting coins they got from begging, and as they get older, to gambling and drugs, thereby creating a vicious cycle that occurs throughout the lives of the residents within the village.

Barriers in hearts

As I listened to the pastor's words, I became puzzled about why residents are not able to get urgently needed help, even though Cebu is a renowned global tourist destination, and Camansi Village is situated in a location that can easily be accessed.

"For some time there have been quite a large number of people who visited this village with the intent to provide assistance. They have handed out bread and cookies, took photographs and won the favor of the residents. Then, they left with the promise that they would solve the issue of the poverty the residents are suffering, but never return again."

As this kind of thing kept happening, the residents of the village appeared to put up a thick and high wall in their hearts against outsiders claiming to have benevolent intent in visiting the village. As such, residents are now demanding money from visitors as if it would be the last time they will be seeing them. If the residents are not getting anything, they simply reject the visitors. They even demand bribes from the local government officials and even interrupt their official activities. This has led to a gradual drop in the number of people visiting the 'Camansi' Village, and it appears to have become a village that no outsiders visit now.

Please become our neighbors. The words of the pastor I heard as I was leaving the village still linger vividly in my mind. "We need neighbors, not visitors." As I was leaving the Camansi Village, I could not promise anything because of the impression that I would not be able to overcome the barriers the residents have erected in their hearts regardless of how sincerely I promise to provide help. Instead, I left the following simple and short promise before I left.

"Dail Community will become your neighbor"

I now have to keep this promise. It is not a promise that can be kept only by spending a lot of money and completing various projects. Please help us to realize this promise of 'becoming their neighbor', which is possible only after having opened up their hearts by spending countless days in their midst! **DAIL**

Although he graduated from elementary school, he could not find means of sustaining his daily life and simply wandered around the squatter settlement in Kunduchi. Then he met Tanzania Dail Community, which offered him new hope. He is currently serving at the Tanzania Dail Community as a scholarship student. Kelvin is looking forward to the day he can unite with his siblings. In particular, Kelvin's heart was broken even further when he heard the news that his youngest brother Josephati is crying every day because he wants to live with his oldest brother.

Kelvin then received a most valuable and wonderful gift from a sponsor, Mi Deuk Jang of Korea, who is enabling him to bring back his younger siblings scattered in other regions of the country by additionally constructing another room to live in and a washroom next to the 1-room hut, the only inheritance his mother left. NEPAL

Please help them to have access to potable water!

Nepal is a country with a land size that is 1.5 times larger than that of South Korea, and has approximately 33 million people. Nepal, also referred to as the roof of the world, has 8 mountain peaks with an elevation of more than 8,000m including Mount Everest, the highest mountain in the world with an elevation of 8,848m. Accordingly, the majority of people in Nepal are living in mountainous regions. Currently, many people in Nepal are still having an extremely difficult time due to the major earthquake that devastated many large villages. In particular, a majority of the villages are in mountainous regions. As such, when mountains move and the earth's crust is twisted, the

waterways are either cut off or changed. This resulted in the inability of residents in many mountainous regions to have access to proper and safe potable water. Although Nepal has the 2nd most water in the world, so many people are currently suffering due to their inability to secure potable water.

Since we started relief work for the earthquake, many people requested assistance with the installation of water supply facilities. Although the term 'facility' may appear to involve extravagant and high-tech equipment, it actually is not something that is complicated or costs a lot. It only needs a concrete structure to gather water from the valley, a hose to connect the water to the village, and a large water tank for

use by the residents of the village. However, the cost of such simple structures is too much for those living in the mountainous regions of Nepal. As such, many people have to climb mountains at substantial distance from the village to bring home potable water to drink.

2 representatives from the Dolakaravilla Village, which is a 7 hour bus ride from Kathmandu, visited Nepal Dail Community several times over the last year with a request for assistance for the construction of a water supply system for their village. As we were searching for someone who could help us, Mr. You, In Sang and Mrs. Baek, Mi Seon told us that they could help and we were able to install a water supply system at the Dolakaravilla Village. With this water supply system, 1,000 resi-

dents of the village (including the 200 students at the school) can now have access to clear and fresh water through hoses connected to the large water tank at the center of the village, and without having to travel to a high mountain far away.

Many more people are still requesting assistance with water supply systems. We sincerely seek your participation in building a more beautiful world to live in with Dail Community. **dail**

Dail kindergarten on the water needs your help.

We have been operating Dail kindergarten on the water since 2009 for the children living in squatter settlements on water. However, the kindergarten, which has been operating harmoniously over the last several years with the loving support of many people, has been experiencing some problems recently. Although the bottom of the kindergarten building is not visible, there are 2 ships that support the foundation of it. Due to the aging of these ships, holes have formed and the ships are continually sinking gradually. Although one of the ships can be repaired for use, the other cannot be repaired and a new ship has to be constructed. It is a fairly large ship with dimensions of 3mX12mX1.2m and it will cost approximately \$6,500 (7.8 million Won), including the cost of construction and labor for reassembly of the existing ship. Repair of these ships is urgent for the education of children in the squatter settlement and we are awaiting your helping hands sincerely. We would be most grateful for the interest of an individual or organization willing to provide assistance. **dail**

Although we are living with many family members, putting on a bandage is the only time for the exchanging of minor consolations through a 1:1 rather than a 1 to many encounter, making it an opportunity that many of our children are seeking. However, even though I understand their mindset, I scold them with comments such as “Why do you want to put a bandage on such a minor wound even though you are old enough to know better?” This is one of my vulnerabilities and weaknesses.

Thinking about it now, what my children ultimately need is not expensive running shoes or wonderful looking padding coats that famous entertainers are wearing. They are just looking for the warm and caring arms of someone who can share their pain by putting on a bandage for them. **DAIL**

'The deaths of nameless homeless people'... 1,200 people without any relatives pass away every year. Korea is about to reach a per capita annual income of US\$30,000 through unprecedented, extraordinary economic growth. However, the proportion of 'homeless people' rapidly increased in Korea during the IMF economic crisis about 20 years ago in the midst of rapid economic growth. The homeless have quickly become a social issue and established themselves as the darker side of our society. Homeless people have been pushed outside the social boundary after having lost jobs and family due to severe economic crisis. Since then, the number of homeless people has continuously increased until now, with more than 1,000 homeless people without any relatives passing away every year.

"Almost all of the homeless people who wander through all corners of the country are afflicted by some forms of disease, both major and minor. Substantial numbers of such homeless people pass away without knowing that they have a disease, and are thus unable to treat it. For various reasons, the death rate of homeless people is more than 3 times that of the general public."

Shadows of death are casted upon the homeless people earlier than others, and they confront the last days of their lives in loneliness and solitude on the streets in the midst of a life of alienation and prejudice. Dail Community, in an effort to prevent these lonely deaths of the homeless, has been operating Dail Little Heaven, a place of convalescence and rest for homeless people, under the mission of 'Until no one faces one's last days of life on the street' since 2011.

People readying themselves for their last days of life in the spring, the season when everything comes alive

A commotion, including the sounds of popping balloons fills up Dail Little Heaven in the early hours of the morning. "Balloons will pop if you grab them like that. Hold this part, like this..." Magic class is in session for the homeless elderly people. The seniors participating in the program are excited by the first arts activities they have done in a long time and are fully concentrating on their works, although they are having a hard time expressing their original intentions in the manner they want.

Dail Little Heaven is striving to become a companion to the homeless elderly in their last days of life by implementing a diverse range of interesting and beneficial programs such as arts therapy, music therapy and laughter therapy, in order for them to end their lives on a more joyous and pleasant note rather than in loneliness and wearisomeness. Thanks to the volunteers and staff of Little Heaven who are serving them at their side, these seniors are able to hold exhibitions of their works of art containing their utmost sincerity and small musical concerts with the instruments they ardently learned to play. As such, everyone at Little Heaven is striving to live a day that is more meaningful and special than yesterday.

"I was anxious if I could not see you for several days, out of the worry that you had passed away... That it would be how I pass away as well..."

Mr. Myunggu Han (alias) who is currently staying at Little Heaven is a gentleman who is thankful for so many things. Whenever we ask if he slept well as we call out his name to hand out the medicine he needs to take, he never forgets to thank us. On the day he first arrived at Little Heaven, he was overflowing with gratitude, and exhilarated for being able to stay at Little Heaven itself.



Mr. Han, who joined Little Heaven and put an end to his prolonged life of homelessness, told us that he observed the death of those who lived on the streets (with him at their side) during his life of being homeless. He would find the cold corpses of his friends on chilly concrete streets without knowing whether they had passed away due to illness or prolonged exposure to cold. Moreover, he would hear the news of the death of those he had not seen and had worried about for a while.

Homeless people are permanently leaving this world without anyone paying attention, and in places that no one knows about. Mr. Han would have been scared that he could end up in a similar and lonely situation as he confronts his death and that he would pitilessly disappear even from the memories of others. Perhaps this is why he is so thankful that Little Heaven is with him during his last days and very grateful for every moment he is staying here.

Nonetheless, the burden of sorrow arising from death still remains grave...

Regardless of the personal reasons that every senior citizen has for joining Little Heaven, the burden of sorrow in confronting death is nonetheless equally grave for everyone. Dail Little Heaven is striving to care for them holistically rather than just for their physical and mental aspects in the midst of combating the immense gravity of the sorrowful end to their lives. Little Heaven considers death not as an end to life but believes it to be just a point in the continuity of being. Accordingly, we are putting in utmost efforts in order for them to tidy up their last days of life in greater comfort from a spiritual perspective.

The farewell service for the departure to heaven, as the last step for seniors in attaining spiritual peace and rest is led personally by Pastor Ildo Choi, the chairman of the board of directors of Dail Community. Dail Little Heaven is striving to offer the last consolation to those staying with us through the farewell service for departure to heaven, as most of them have no close relatives or are unable to get in contact with them. The elderly and staff of Little Heaven are humbly accepting such departures as they are being sent to a better world, and prudently see them off by putting in efforts to withhold tearful hearts.

Accordingly, we sincerely hope and strive to enable them to depart from the current life in peace rather than in extreme solitude. 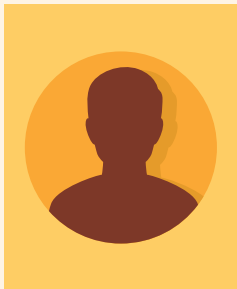

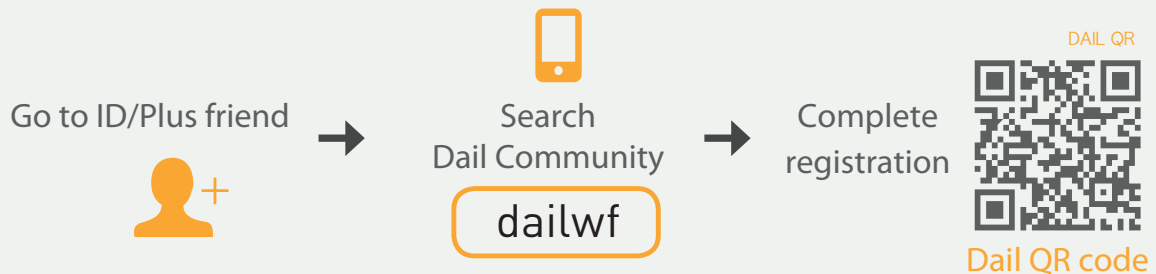
