



The total number of meals shared, after having commenced at Cheongnyangni Station Square in 1988, exceeded 10 million on May 22. All this is the grace of God. I would like to thank all the family members of Dail who strode the path of sharing meals with unified hearts during the last 29 years. Moreover, I would like to convey my sincere gratitude to more than half a million volunteers who participated in the sharing of love through Babfor.

Currently, I am in the middle of a Tanzania Vision Trip in Africa with our honorary ambassador, Mr. Sang Won Park. Children in the squatter settlement of Kunduchi Quarry in Tanzania are sustaining their lives by crushing stones for 12 hours a day in order to earn less than \$1, without being able to enjoy the right to the education that they deserve.

It just broke my heart to see the children hammering the stones with their tiny hands all day. Accordingly, Dail Community has been making preparations since 2014 to establish the Africa Dail Vision Center (Dail Hope Center) for the enhancement of health and hygiene as well as education for the children of Kunduchi Quarry, who are referred to as the most impoverished class of people even within Tanzania. However, due to the lack of funds, we have not been making any progress other than having purchased the land for the center.

I sincerely pray that we will be able to complete the construction of the Vision Center, a long-cherished project in Tanzania, this year. Moreover, I hope that the children of Tanzania, with the broad African continent in their hearts, will be able to grow into greater youth who dream of a better future through the Vision Center. 

Concert held for seniors on parents' day along with Symphony Song of Dail Community

Babfor Sharing Movement of Dail Community held a special concert on Parents' Day on May 8. It was a concert prepared by 'Symphony Song', a 21stcentury type representative orchestra from Korea that plays a leading role in establishment of new culture as it is composed of young and passionate members, and performed for the culturally alienated classes of our society, including seniors with no one to rely on and homeless people.


This concert began at 10:30AM through the sponsorship of Mr. Yeong Jae Han, the chairman of Noru Holdings, and continued for about 1 hour under the direction of the artistic director, Shin Ik Ham.

The Symphony Song orchestra, led by art director Mr. Sin Ik Ham, who is also a professor of conducting at the Music Conservatory at Yale

University in the USA, is pursuing 「The Wing □ a Wing project」 aimed at assisting the people of culturally alienated regions unable to experience cultural benefits to enjoy amicable classical music by personally visiting such regions and performing sophisticated classical concerts on a wing-body truck.

Mr. Sin Ik Ham, the art director, commented during the concert under the name of 「The Wing □ a Wing Project」that "the main dish today is the music, and the foods you will be having later on are the supplementary dishes" and asked the seniors at Babfor to enjoy the music together. I selected jaunty and vigorous pieces including Light Calvary Overture, Flight of Bumblebees, William Tell Overture, etc. that the seniors are familiar with and able to enjoy.

After the concert, Dail Community held a time to present postcards that were handwritten by the staff and volunteers, and put carnations on the lapels of some 700 seniors. Postcards presented to the seniors were prepared through the campaign to "Write a Letter of Gratitude" held since last April. Seeing them read the postcards with their eyes fixed on each and every word with reddened eyes also moved all of us with poignancy.










- Mr. Sin In Ham, the artistic director, participating in Babfor service after the performance

Miss Soo Yong Kim, a sponsorship member

Q. How do you do? Could you introduce yourself?

I am Soo Yong Kim and I am currently in 2nd year at Byeongjeom High School in Hwaseong City, Gyeonggi-do. I live with my parents and an older brother. With a simple and cool personality, I get along amicably with all my friends without major trouble. I am currently reading a lot of psychology literature as I have a lot of interest in criminal psychology and am actively participating in related club activities. Occasionally, I go to see theatrical plays or movies with my friends whenever I feel under a lot of stress, just like my peers.

Q. You have been continuously serving at Babfor. What prompted the start of your participation in this voluntary service?

I joined Babfor service for the first time along with the staff of my father's company when I was in the 4th grade of elementary school. I naturally started voluntary services by tagging along with my father rather than from some other particular opportunity. When I first began, I was too young to use the stove or a knife. As such, I was given tasks such as peeling ginger or cleaning vegetables. Although I thought I was not much help at the time, seniors who came to Babfor for meals frequently praised me and showed me affection as if I was their grandchild. Such praise made me more excited and more determined to participate in voluntary services. Since then, I seem to have followed my father without being told to when the time for Babfor services comes.

Q. What is the most memorable experience during your participation in Babfor services?

I cannot forget the first day of my participation in the voluntary service. I absolutely had no idea that there are so many seniors who could not have meals because they have no rice. I still remember the endless line up of seniors who came to have a meal and scenes of several hundred seniors having meals at Babfor vividly. Whenever we visited our grandfather in the countryside. he would show the rice he harvested to my father and ask "aren't vou taking rice?" My father would respond that "I still have the rice you sent me before." However, seniors who visit Babfor do not have the rice that is always in excess at my home. As I was serving meals to the seniors on the first day, I realized that not everyone enjoys the affluence I am fortunate to have. This awakening remains the most memorable experience from the first day of voluntary service at Babfor.

Q. You have been making donations to Babfor over the last 7 years. What was the reason that enabled you to make donations for such a long time although you are at an age at which you may feel the allowance you are given may not be sufficient?

When I participate in Babfor services, I frequently meet a lot of seniors who come to Babfor for a meal alone. Some seniors would come by determinedly pulling a cart filled with waste paper in the middle of the sweltering heat of summer, and bitter and bone-chilling cold weather of winter for a meal. I am always lost for words whenever I saw them. On the other hand, my heart substantially warmed up when I saw those sharing coal briquettes or Kimchi for the winter season with the seniors. I was simply moved by such experiences rather than having some definitive reasons. My heart ached at seeing those needing help and became happy at the sight of those offering helping hands. I think I continued to practice sharing, albeit a small amount of money, because I was able to experience a great deal of joy whenever I was able to personally offer some help to those in need.

Q. It is by no means an easy thing to continuously engage in voluntary services or regularly make donations from an early age. Do you have a role model for the practicing of sharing?

My grandmother and mother are my role models. They both are similar in that they are very generous. As such, they would offer an abundance of meals and shared foods with those visiting our home and those having difficulties. Amazingly, I found that my grandmother and mother who are practicing sharing always appeared to be happier than those they were helping. Therefore, my grandmother and mother are my role models, as they showed me the joy of sharing and the experience of a greater abundance in my heart the more I share. However, I feel limited at the moment because I am a student. I would like to practice more abundant sharing than now when I become an independent adult, just like my grandmother and mother.

Q. Lastly, as a sponsor of Dail Community, could you make a comment for all those who love Dail Community?

I think that the culture for sharing and donation in Korea is substantially inadequate in comparison to the advanced countries. Accordingly, I asked my father the reason for this. He told me that although Koreans are gentle and full of compassion, the 'sorrowful history of having to safeguard against poverty or having others take away what is ours' due to the frequent invasion by foreign powers throughout the history of Korea may be one of several reasons for the comparatively inadequate culture for sharing and donation. This led to a poor system of education for sharing and donation, resulting in the poor establishment of a culture for sharing in Korea. However, I believe that the culture of sharing is continuously expanding recently at a very slow pace. I also think that the spirit of sharing of the general public could generate a more powerful force than the welfare system of the country. Therefore, it would be wonderful if all those who love Dail Community would continuously share a little of what they hold dear as I have been doing. I pray that everyone who loves Dail will put their efforts together until the day in which the culture of 1 donation by 1 person will firmly settle in Korea. Dall

Q. What kind of restaurant is Jeonju Gapgihoegwan?

It is a restaurant specializing in Jeonju Bibimbap. There are 6 representative restaurants that specialize in Jeonju Bibimbap in Jeonju City and most of these have been in business for more than 50 years. My restaurant has been open for about 30 years and is a latecomer in comparison to these 6 restaurants. Nonetheless, it is leading in the sharing of Bibimbap.

Q. How did you come to assist with the preparation of large scale Bibimbap for Dail Community?

I was first contacted by Dail Community in 2014 and was asked if I could provide support for the making of a large scale Bibimbap in commemoration of reaching 7 million meals shared at Babfor. At the time, I heard a lot about Pastor Ildo Choi, the chairman of the board of directors of Dail Community, at the church I was attending. As a person who loved and wanted to have Jeonju Bibimbap to be known more widely, I always respected Pastor Ildo Choi who was sharing love through the distribution of meals. Accordingly, I was glad to readily accommodate the request of Dail Community upon hearing it. This prompted me to provide a helping hand at this event in commemoration of the 10 million meals shared.

Q. I would think the quantity of ingredients used in preparation of 2,000 servings of Bibimbap was huge. What was the greatest difficulty in this arduous and challenging task?

Since it is food, it was not possible to prepare the ingredients too far in advance in order to maintain the freshness of the ingredients. Therefore, I began preparations for the food one or two

days before the event. It was burdensome to complete preparations of a huge quantity of ingredients within a relatively short period of time when I do not have that many staff at the restaurant. In particular, although I have the experience of having prepared 1,000 servings of Bibimbap several times, this was the first time I attempted the preparation of 2,000 servings of Bibimbap. Looking back, all aspects of the task, including correctly measuring the ingredients necessary, cooking all the ingredients, transferring the prepared ingredients to the site of the event by getting up at 4AM with a truck, and setting the tables in time for serving were quite difficult and challenging.

Q. We are informed that you have been sharing Bibimbap in a diverse range of locations for quite some time.

Yes. I have been continuously practicing sharing of large scale Bibimbap (up to 1,000 servings) for more than 20 years. Moreover, I have been sharing Bibimbap with the local seniors in May every year. I served Jeonju Bibimbap to more than 350 local seniors on May 13 this year. I was so grateful that every one of them thoroughly enjoyed the food I served them.

Q. Is there any particular incident that prompted you to engage in sharing activities?

When I was young, my parents, who were managing a granary at the time, cooked rice and offered it to others who were hungry simply for the reason that they were hungry. They all looked very happy as they were having meals. Perhaps because I grew up by naturally seeing such scenes during my childhood, I came to think that it is only natural that I share what I have with those who are in need. I seem to have naturally learned to share in the midst of daily living.

Q. What is sharing to you?

I believe sharing is to 'give as your heart directs'. Obviously, it would not be possible to share all you have with others unconditionally when you do not have sufficient means of sustaining your own life. However, if you start to excessively value all that you have and safeguard it, you would not be able to share with others regardless of how affluent you may be. Therefore, I experienced greater joy when sharing rather than excessively clinging to what I have and I intend to act when the thought of the desire to share enters my mind. I sincerely hope that a greater number of people would become more familiar with the sharing exercised as the heart directs rather than calculated sharing, by experiencing the joy of sharing with others.



Introducing an Angel Company of Dail Community!

Gwang Sook Kim, a legal scrivener at Changdeok Judicial Scrivener Angel Company refers to all the shops and companies of the world that practice sharing and who lead the culture of sharing by making regular donations of a prescribed amount of money for the alienated neighbors along with Dail Community.

Changdeok Judicial Scrivener is a judicial scrivener office with 17 years of history since its opening in 2000. It specializes in registration work along with other civil litigation cases. The duties of this office are the same as a lawyer's office, with the only exception of the provision of defense in legal litigations. It has the advantage of charging lower fees in comparison to a lawyer's fees for the same tasks.

Q. How did you come to know about Dail Community?

I met Mr. Yeon Soo Kim, the representative, in the early years of Dail Community during the meeting of the parents of elementary school students because the son of Pastor Ildo Choi and my son graduated from the same elementary school. Moreover, Pastor Choi lives in the same apartment building I lived in. As such, I had frequent encounters with the family members of the Pastor and got to know of the Dail Community project.

Q. What is sharing to you?

I believe sharing is practicing. The reason why I love Dail is the spirit of practicing of Dail under the motto of "From this point on! From here! Starting with little things! Beginning with things that can be done! Starting from me!" Dail simply practices what it has in mind first. This is how changes are achieved and I believe this is truly valuable. I frequently hear at the church that Christians should serve our neighbors. Perhaps you may think it is an arrogant attitude, but I think it is rare that those asserting this need actually practice what they assert in reality. If you stop at being knowledgeable, is there any meaning or value to the knowledge that you have? Therefore, I believe practicing that does not stop at being knowledgeable is the way of sharing.

Q. Have there been any changes in your life prior to and after sharing activities?

Prior to my engagement in sharing activities, I put foremost importance in my life on my family and me. Therefore, I was extremely greedy to safeguard what is mine. However, when you visit and engage in the voluntary services at the project sites of Dail in Korea and overseas, you personally meet neighbors experiencing difficulties. When you personally encounter and share with them, all your greed disappears before you know it. You will also come to know how happy your current life is. My life has become much more abundant after sharing than before I started to share.

Introducing an Angel Church of Dail Community!

Angel Church refers to a church that personally practices the Words of "what is done onto the lowest of people is what is done onto me (MATTHEW) 25:40)" and that expands the kingdom of God by becoming the salt and light of the earth by making a regular donation of a prescribed amount for the alienated neighbors along with Dail Community.

This interview was held with Pastor Woo Seok Jeong, who is in charge of Life Fountain Church, a healthy church with the presence of Holy Spirit, who has been continuously delivering the Words of God over the last 17 years for souls without faith there.

Q. Please tell us about Life Fountain Church

It is a healthy church always putting in the utmost effort to sincerely worship the only God. Our church holds a worship service for the subjects of evangelism in the first week of every month. It is a service focused on the church members in their initial stage of Christian life, rather than the existing members of our church. Accordinaly, the contents of the sermon and its delivery method are slightly different from the traditional worship services. It is a unique consideration that Life Fountain Church is making for the church members in their initial stage of Christian life. In addition, we engage in evangelistic activities by utilizing our individual talents. I believe this is also a characteristic of Life Fountain Church that is differentiated from other churches. For example, one of our members who worked as an English teacher for the national college entrance exam in the past is naturally passing the Words of God while teaching English and math to the local children. Other members with talent in sports such as boxing or swimming are engaged in evangelistic activities by teaching boxing or swimming as a form of talent donation.

Q. What prompted Life Fountain Church to join as an angel church?

Sharing is something that all Christians need to practice. However, the majority only have the thought of sharing but have difficulty in practicing it. They tend to postpone it day by day. However, I believe one must practice sharing immediately when one considers it, rather than at a later date. Accordingly, realizing that our church members were unified with a passion for voluntary services, I immediately visited Babfor of Dail Community and began participating in Babfor services. While participating in the Babfor services, I was given the offer of joining as an angel church. After having received the proposal, I thought about how we go out to eat frequently these days. If we substitute the cost of a meal a day (8,000 Won) spent outside with a meal at home, it is possible to save approximately 200,000 Won a month. Therefore, with the small efforts of saving the cost of a meal eaten outside a day, we collected donations every month to participate in the activities of Dail Community as an angel church.

Q. What is the topic of prayers at the Life Fountain Church?

We are praying to be awakened all the time to become a church capable of evangelizing to our loved ones, a church where the pastor and the members of the church can truly believe in and pray for each other under any circumstances, and a church capable of sincerely saving each and every soul rather than stopping at seeing and experiencing certain forms.

The story of Liil, an assistant administrator of Dail Community, who is preparing for Bbangfor ministry at Dail Community in Vietnam

Q1. What are you doing currently Liil?

I bake bread and hand it out to impoverished neighbors at an overseas branch of Dail Community. It has been about 4~5 years since I started doing this work and I am currently preparing for Bbangfor ministry at Vietnam Dail Community. Dail Community is distributing meals and bread to impoverished neighbors at 17 branches in 10 countries. In the case of Vietnam, baking and sharing of bread is not being done for several reasons. Accordingly, I came to Vietnam Dail Community in Tan Hung Village in Ho Chi Minh City as the first member for the Bbangfor ministry.

Q2. It would have been a rather difficult decision to pursue a life of sharing. Did you have a particular opportunity that prompted you to pursue this way of life?

I do not have parents. I lived the life of a wanderer since I was 5 years old, and I joined the Dail Community orphanage in China when I was 11 years old. China Dail Community is situated in Mijiang in the Duman River region that is at the border between China and North Korea. Accordingly, I frequently encountered escapees from North Korea when I was young. When I was in the 6th grade of elementary school, I was baking potatoes with a younger sibling at the orphanage in the boiler room when a woman with a young child came barging into the boiler room. She was an escapee from North Korea. Without any explanation, she asked me to give her something to eat because she was so hungry. Since I had experienced and knew about severe hunger as I went without anything to eat for several days when I was very young, I brought

some rice and Kimchi for her. After completely emptying the dishes, she thanked me over and over, and it was the first time I thought that 'it would be very fulfilling if I were to lead a life of sharing things with those who truly and sincerely need them'.

Q3. When did you begin to think about pursuing the ministry of Bbangfor?

When I was about to advance to high school, I came to know of Duman River Technical School where bread was being baked from 7PM to 8AM the following morning every day. I was told that approximately 1,800~2,000 loaves baked at the school are sent to North Korea every day at the time. I was fully drawn to this story. I think this story was so appealing to me because I dreamt of pursuing a life of sharing things to eat with less fortunate neighbors when I was young. decided to enroll at Duman River Technical School with the firm conviction that it was place where I could realize my dreams and, at the school, I was able to experience the joy

of delivering happiness to others with the skills I had for the first time in my life. Since then, I learned about Babfor and Bbangfor, the ministry of sharing of meals and bread, through the introduction of the director of China Dail Community, and I naturally began the life of sharing at Dail Community.

Q4. 4~5 years is quite a long period of time. You must have had numerous occasions of emotional fulfillment while sharing bread.

I first began baking and sharing bread in Siem Reap, Cambodia and the second location of ministry was Nepal. I particularly remember the experiences of baking and sharing breads in Nepal very well. I was in the Pokhara region in Nepal, which was not an area with well-developed food culture. Accordingly, the majority of the children in this region encountered bread for the first time. The first bread I baked for the children was Streusel. I still cannot forget the facial expressions of the children having the first taste of Streusel in their lives. They were amazed at the taste and really enjoyed it. Seeing how happy the children became, I felt extreme joy surging up in my heart. Although every moment of making and sharing bread has been fulfilling, those in Nepal were the most fulfilling and moving experiences in my life thus far.

Q5. What kind of life do you want to live as a staff member of Dail Community?

I was able to receive sincere and genuine care and concern for the first time in my life at the Dail Community. I encountered this after a prolonged period of life as a wanderer during my early childhood. Even when I was going astray, the attention directed towards me was always warm and cozy. In this process, I nurtured the desire to live a valuable life and began to have dreams and hope for the future. Just as Dail Community has showed me hope in life by warmly embracing me, I also would like to become a person

A step taken towards a wider world

The new school year begins in April in Nepal. Accordingly, all the schools hold graduation and enrollment ceremonies in April. Nepal Dail Hope School also held graduation and enrollment ceremonies. Kumari Chepang, who is the tallest and oldest student at the Hope School, graduated from the 4th year there at the age of 14 years old and will be enrolled at a regular public school.

Just as there are a lot of Sherpa clans living in the Himalayas, a lot of Jepang clans are living in the jungles. Jepang clans that lead life of severance from the outside civilized society are putting efforts in to join the outside society by leaving their lives in the jungle. However, the reality confronted by the Jepang clans is that they have difficulties in securing sufficient funds just to rent a room when they leave the jungle.

Kumari's family was considering returning to jungle

life again because of the severe difficulties in sustaining life in Kathmandu. Thankfully, they were able to maintain their life in Kathmandu by paying the monthly rent due to the sponsorship of Hye Jeona Hwang who visited Nepal during a Dail Vision Trip. Kumari has been having meals at the Dail Vision Center for the last 4 years and was enrolled in the Hope School 2 years ago. At first, Kumari had to begin school life in loneliness, having to eat and spend her leisurely hours alone because of her difficulties in communicating with other students because she was the last to join the Hope School and had been living a life separate from the outside civilization. However, she is now able to study in the Nepali language and English through the dedication and love of teachers at the Hope School, and was able to quickly make friends with her peers as her linguistic ability improved rapidly every day.

As she has been transformed from a girl who lived in jungle with no knowledge of civilization to a capable student through the love of the teachers, she wants to share and offer love to other students by becoming a teacher. We ask for your encouragement and support for the realization of her dream.

New uniforms and school supplies for the new semester of the new school year

As the new school year started, we distributed new school uniforms and supplies to the children attending ordinary public schools. School uniforms, notebooks, pencils and pencil sharpeners were handed out to lower grade students while school uniforms, notebooks, pens, ink and math learning aids were handed out to the higher grade students.

In school in Nepal, the amount of note taking is substantial, with the school requiring a minimum of 2 notebooks for each subject. Accordingly, the number of notebooks required is close to 30 since the students are taking about 14 subjects for each grade. As many schools check whether the students have prepared a sufficient number of notebooks, many of the students not able to prepare them due to financial difficulties have a tendency of missing school during this period.

However, we are so grateful that our children do not have such concerns, which have been resolved through distribution of sufficient school supplies at the beginning of the new school year. Faces of the children were brimming with smiles as they received them. We are perpetually grateful to our sponsors who enabled our children to commence the new school year with a great deal of excitement and expectations.



With prayers for construction of a middle and high school

There is an urgent need to construct schools for the youths in the areas of Siem Reap, phnom krom and chong kneas. Among the youths in these regions, more than 75% are driven to various sites of hard labor without the financial means to attend school, or are unable to advance to higher grades even if they are above the appropriate age because they are not able to receive supplementary lessons, or are without sufficient opportunities for education and only halfa-day of schooling. We are planning to construct and operate regular all-day school for these youths. It is anticipated that these youths will grow into members of society capable of further renewing Cambodia by demonstrating the leadership in serving others through regular middle and high school education with books in their hands in school rather than hammers in work places.

On May 8, the 4th literary composition competition organized by Cambodia Dail Community and sponsored by the Korea Writers Missionary Association was held with the participation of approximately 80 youths from Siem Reap and chong kneas regions. As in the competition last year, all the participants showed off their writing skills with wonderful and compassionate content.

We hope that these educational programs that we are implementing in Cambodia Dail Community at the moment will be well established at middle and high schools, and we are praying and waiting for those who will help with the construction of a middle and high school jointly with Cambodia Dail Community.

Scholarship Center for achieving dreams, towards Ggumfor

There are university students who managed to grow in good health in the outlying urban squatter village of Siem Reap through Babfor of Cambodia Dail Community. Cambodia Dail Community is planning to establish Ggumfor, which is a scholarship center in the city for the realization of the students' dream of completing university studies.

A short while ago, a tent library was opened for them in advance of the establishment of the scholarship center. Honorable Judge Jong Ho Cheon, a judge at Busan Family Court who is better known as a scolding judge, and 20 adolescents under minor probation erected this tent library. Through the efforts of the Honorable Judge Jong Ho Cheon, all the materials needed were transported from Korea and erected with sincerity in Cambodia. It made me so happy just to think about the students who will be studying hard in this tent library.

Following the construction of the library, our anticipation that the Ggumfor scholarship center could be established quickly also grew. We need approximately \$75,000 to establish the scholarship center in which 50 students will pursue the realization of their dreams. We wait for your helping hands and encouragement for the dreams of these students to ensure that they will not give up because of the poverty they are confronted with. Pall

Please help families living in earthen houses!

There is a major rainy season from March to May in Tanzania. In particular, there have been very heavy rainfalls during this May, putting many families living in earthen houses in a great deal of difficulty, as they are most vulnerable to rain among the houses in the squatter village in Kunduchi Quarry. Among these, the houses of Sophia, and the siblings Cecilia and Paolo who were introduced in the last newsletter suffered the greatest damages.

In the last newsletter we introduced that the last

wish of the mother of Sophia who is suffering from AIDS is to purchase this dilapidated earthen house to pass down to her 5 children. Accordingly, the staff of Tanzania Dail Community purchased the earthen house and were collecting funds to newly construct a sturdy house with bricks that can withstand even the worst rainfall by ardently selling charcoal. Then, God, realizing the inadequacies of our efforts, sent us a precious sponsorship angel. We sincerely thank God and the sponsorship angel who fulfilled even the material aspects of our needs.

Immediately following the rainy season, Ibra, Abu, Sophia's older brother and I made an effort to repair the earthen house of Sophia that was on the verge of collapse, and we were able to complete the framework and wall construction of the house after 4 days of house repair. Words of praises of joy naturally flowed out of me with the thought of 'how much happier would they be if we were to reconstruct the earthen house purchased into a brick house' as I was looking at Sophia's family members brightly smiling after the house repair. Halleluiah!

Siblings Cecilia and Paolo, who are students from the 1st and 3rd session Hope Class, respectively,

are being raised by their aunt after both of their parents passed away. Their aunt is living in a single-room earthen house without electricity or water supply with 5 children including her own 2, and Cecilia, Paolo and the youngest child. However, they are the "happy virus" family of the Kunduchi village as they always display untainted smiles on their faces.

But one day, Cecilia visited me with a look of concern on her face. She asked me to go to her house with her. When we arrived, I found that one side of the earthen house had been swept away by the recent heavy rainfall. Accordingly, I completed 3 days of house repair along with Ibra, Abu and Cecilia in order to save labor cost. To make the house sturdier, we applied new soil on the wall and covered it with cement. My heart ached at the sight of Cecilia and Paolo repetitively shouting "Asante! Asante!" out of gratitude for the newly repaired and improved house.

Families living in earthen houses incurred major damages due to extremely heavy rainfall during the last rainy season. Houses with holes in the walls or with walls collapsed will be directly exposed to the risk of malaria. As such, Tanzania Dail Community would like to repair them as quickly as possible. We ask that those who are moved by this article

would assertively participate in our efforts to repair these houses.

Kamansi Dail Community, the venue of dreams for the children

We visited Kamansi Village to practice sharing and serving the poorest neighbors in Cebu without any information or guidance. After having met Pastor Edgar, who is also the head of the clan at Kamansi Village that we visited on short notice, we were able to build up sufficient trust for each other by sharing a big vision over a very short period of time. This led to the entering of a partnership between Dail Community and Datu Mapaubsanon clan within about 2 months.

Moreover, my family was appointed an honorary member of the clan and peace ambassador by the Federation of aborigine clans. I was given the clan name of "Kali Tawong Banwaon Matinabangon" meaning "Man of Assistance" and my wife the name of "Bae Masinabtanon" meaning "Woman of Understanding," thereby obtaining the qualification to officially visit and interact with any clans from this highly closed aborigine society.

Following the establishment of Kamansi Dail Community and beginning Bbanafor with a drum oven discarded at one corner of the church, there were only about 30 children who came to have bread we baked. However, this has increased to more than 100 after about 2 months. As we distributed nutritious bread made by putting calcium and vitamin powder in the dough along with beverages filled with a lot of nutrition, the children appeared to be quite satisfied with both the taste and nutritional value of the bread and beverages. Moreover, following Bbangfor, we sincerely applied ointments to children to alleviate skin diseases that manifested from the dirty water used in their daily lives. For these reasons, the children would stay on the Kamansi Dail Church grounds all day long.

As I am looking at these children, the urgency to provide an optimal environment to educate them by establishing a venue of learning as soon as possible surges up in my heart. However, as the church is located in the squatter settlement on water, there is an extensive range of difficulties, including the need to connect electricity and potable water supply first, execute construction work in time for the normal tides of the ocean, and transporting construction materials through the passage made of a maze of wooden planks

on top of water. Nonetheless, I muster my energy on the strength of the members of the clans who willingly volunteer to provide assistance.

Currently, we are planning to construct a venue for Babfor for the sharing of daily meals for the children and a library, which will become the playground and venue for nurturing their dreams by expanding the Kamansi Church that Pastor Edgar arduously maintained on his own. Accordingly, we sincerely need your prayers and assistance in order for the children of Kamansi to lead a more child-like life in a better environment through Kamansi Dail Community. Dail

Everyone was truly enjoying the first long distance trip they were making in a long time.

Abiding by the old proverb that 'A loaf of bread is better than the song of many birds', we brought the seniors to the Jeongseon Market, the largest in Jeongseon City, to have lunch. Fortunately, the Jeongseon 5-day traditional market that is renowned as the largest traditional market in Gangwon-do was held on the day. As such, the seniors were able to enjoy pungent noodles and rice cooked with thistle that can only be tasted in Jeongseon before looking around the market overflowing with an abundance of things that cannot be found in Seoul. Seniors were smilling throughout their tour of the market, perhaps as they reminisced about childhood memories.

After having completed the tour of the market, we were headed for the last destination, the Cheonpo Gold Mine next to the Hwaam Cave. Gold was mined here from 1922 to 1945, and the seniors appeared to be quite satisfied with the tour of the cool cave in the midst of sweltering summer weather.

The last moments of life

Dail Little Heaven is a facility that admits and cares for homeless people with no one to rely on and who suffer from serious diseases that make them unable to care for themselves, as well as cancer patients waiting for the last moments of their lives. Dail Little Heaven is the only facility that admits homeless people among other similar facilities and implements a specialized funeral program for accompaniment and consoling of the seniors during their lonely last moments of life.

The photograph above is the scene of the funeral of Mr. Jeong Seung Ham (false name) who entered Dail Little Heaven last February upon the request of Yangpyeong Resting Place. Although he needed to undergo anti-cancer therapy due to pancreatic cancer that metastasized to his entire body, he refused to be treated. As the disease seriously aggravated, he eventually passed away at the Dongbu City Hospital on May 12. We finally managed to get in contact with his family who we were unable to contact before and notified them of his condition. Accordingly, his family visited Dail Little Heaven to participate in the farewell ceremony for Mr. Ham's passage to heaven and cremation. Although it was belated, we were

nonetheless thankful that we were able to cherish the last day of Mr. Ham with his family.

Mr. Choi was suffering from lung cancer with a particularly severe cough, to the extent of not being able to conduct his daily activities on his own. Moreover, as his coughing caused extensive inconvenience to other patients admitted at Daily Little Heaven, Mr. Choi was transferred to the hospice ward at the Seoul Medical Center last April. Although he bravely and ardently fought against cancer during his stay at the hospital for 2~3 months, the cancer metastasized to other organs and eventually he passed away on May 25. Although Mr. Choi refrained from getting in contact with his relatives other than his younger sister, many of his relatives visited the funeral parlor upon the news of his death to bid farewell for his passage to heaven. Little Heaven prayed for the repose of the deceased to ensure that the last days of Mr. Choi, who desperately struggled with cancer on his own, would not have been lonely. Little Heaven shall continue to be a comforting companion for the admitted seniors during their last days of life. Pall
